

Upper St Clair River Shoreline Restoration:  
 Port Huron

Designers: Interpretive Ideas

Along the shoreline of Port Huron, visitors can take in nature while strolling the Blue Water River Walk. And now, thanks to the St Clair County Community Foundation and the creative work of Interpretive Ideas, visitors can also learn of the Area’s significance and importance to nature.

In 2013, it became necessary to restore the shoreline along the Blue Water River Walk. Interpretive Ideas created a series of CHPL interpretives to help send out a message and create a theme for visitors. The new soft shoreline has restored the fish spawning and nursery habitats, The shoreline sign project theme brought to life: “This shoreline celebrates a strategic location and a unique natural environment.”

iZone Imaging’s Custom High Pressure Laminate was selected for its long term durability and attractiveness. A unique custom-cut wave design and tactile elements create a one of a kind display. Wildwood Studios created three bronze sculptures representing the animals that the shoreline restoration hopes to encourage. These sculptures were attached to the panels by iZone Imaging before being shipped to be set into place for visitors to marvel at.
