School Wall Mural

Before it was established as the town of Yelm, WA, this prairie land was a crossroads of Native American trails and would eventually play a crucial role for fur traders, the British operators of the Hudson Bay Company, American settlers and eventually the Northern Pacific Railroad.

Yelm Middle School wanted to showcase the significance of the town's history by decorating their hallways with murals that described the years leading up to its establishment. They first utilized the aid of architect BCRA, who specified a durable panel that could stand up to the daily use of students walking down these busy corridors. With the aid of Doty + Associates, who provided iZone's High Pressure Laminate, the artwork for the murals was designed, approved, and fabricated.
